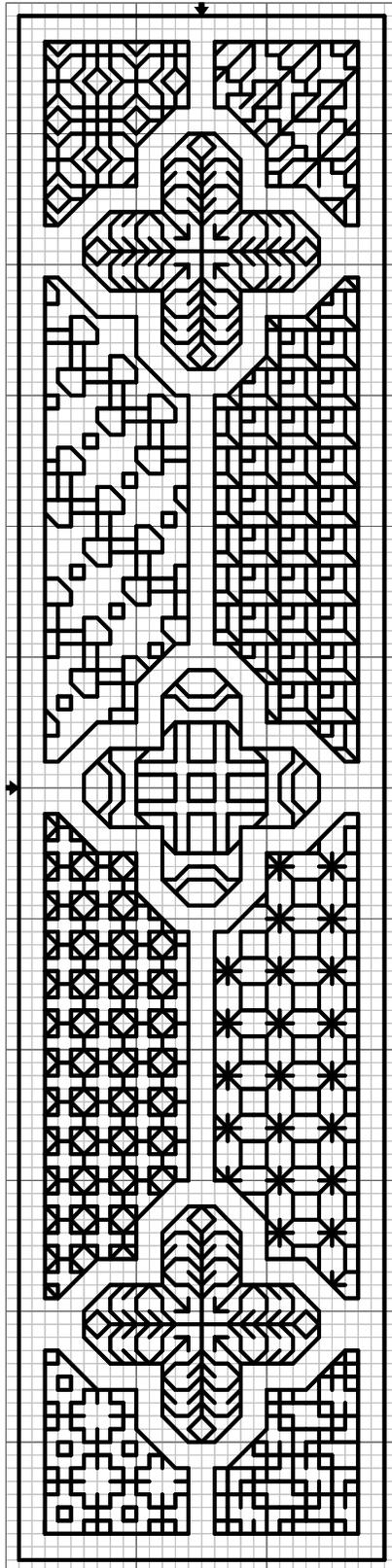


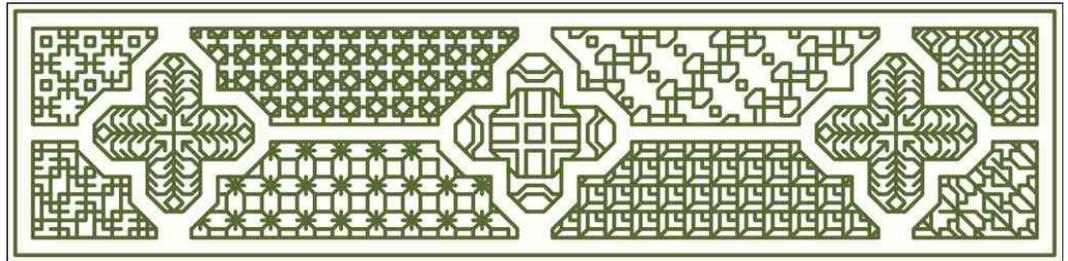
POCKET GARDEN OF 4-LEAF CLOVER - #BO-B204

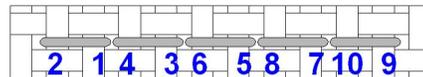

So why the four-leaf clover? Tuck it in your book, and carry the good luck which follows it. It never hurts to believe!

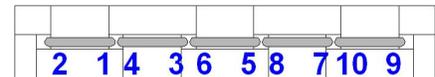


PROJECT SIZE

Stitches	28 x 118
14 Count	2" x 8-3/8"
16 Count	1-3/4" x 7-3/8"
18 Count	1-1/2" x 6-1/2"
22 Count	1-1/4" x 5-1/4"

Blackwork is historically done in black thread. In today's world where we have the full range of colors, as well as the hand-dyed and variegated threads, there are countless possibilities for your project.

Do your blackwork piece in all 1 thread, or use multiple colors for the various parts of it - that's your own choice! Customize it with color as you wish.

Also, there's no set rule as to the number of strands or thickness of thread you need to use. Try out a couple of options on a sample piece of your chosen fabric - you decide how fine or how bold you want the stitching to be. Use a combination by using 2 strands for the borders of your sampler areas, with 1 strand for the fills themselves.
